	To provide for a transparent level of competitive fairness, senior archers should shoot the distance category relative to their handicap achievement. If the handicaps below (or of a lower value) are achieved by senior archers, then the distance category to be entered is: New National or Long National.

Juniors wishing to shoot in the senior rounds must pay the senior fee to do so and will be competing against the seniors for medals.						
	Seniors and Juniors						
	If an archer wishes to shoot in an age category that is lower than their own, they can do so and can so be awarded medals. Please specify on the entry form that you are shooting out of category. To be eligible for the County Novice Award an archer must be shooting within their age category.						
	Registered Disabled Archers						
	Archers registered as "Disabled" with Archery GB can compete in shorter distance categories show they feel their condition affects their ability to shoot in their recognised category. Please specify on the entry form if shooting under the disability category.

	The competition will include hosting the "County Novice Award" for both seniors & juniors. Please "Yes" to the question "Are you a Novice Archer" on the entry form if you are a Novice. 	Archery GB Imperial Outdoor Rounds 5 Zone Scoring.					
	The maximum number of archers on a target shall be four. The archers on each target shall be designated A-B, C-D, in the order in which they appear on the target list. Rotation shall be optional (Judge's decision).					
	Archers will shoot ends of six arrows under Method 2 of the Rules of Shooting - timed ends controlled by audible signals.

Awards	Medals to be awarded to 1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd in each category.					
	County Novice Award : The best senior and junior archer shooting within age category will receive a trophy which they will keep for one year.					
Rules and Dress	Archery GB Rules of Shooting will apply.					
Code	Only clothing in compliance with Rule 307 will be permitted. Blue Denim, Olive Drab and Camouflage are not allowed.					
Lost Arrows	All arrows must be accounted for. In accordance with Archery GB rules, searches for lost arrows must not delay shooting. Searches for lost arrows may continue after completion of the tournament when the work party may assist.					
	Lost arrows must be reported to a Judge or the Tournament Organiser (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow). It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field.					
	It would be advantageous if all carbon arrows were fitted with pin nocks, as this would assist when searching for potential lost arrows.					
Data Protection	By entering this competition, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems, Archery GB and other competitors.
